Preston is a Tuscumbia High School graduate. While in high school he completed a two-year building trades course through the Tri-County Technical College (TCTC) associated with the Eldon High School.

After high school, he worked for Thomas Construction in Osage Beach, APAC (asphalt producing company), the Eldon Special Road District where he helped maintain 60 miles of roads and Lake Ozark Sand & Gravel before joining the City of Lake Ozark in 2006.
